

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR



In 2014/15 the Greater Wellington Regional Council (GWRC) delivered a number of significant initiatives which impact on both our natural environment and the resilience of the greater Wellington region.

- In public transport, GWRC delivered 36.4 million passenger trips, which equates to a 1.7 percent increase from 2013/14. Annual rail patronage reached 12.1 million trips.
- In June the 10 Year Plan — that highlights the changes and priorities and spending over the next 10 years — was signed off. The Plan drew on extensive community engagement and will help future proof our region.
- The Proposed Natural Resources Plan for the Wellington Region was released for consultation. The Plan sets limits for natural resource use and quality, without compromising opportunities for sustainable economic growth.

Through these initiatives — and others — the GWRC is working to make our region safe, resilient and prosperous.

How much are regional rates in 2015/16?

The average regional council residential property rate in **Kapiti Coast is \$352.69.**

The region's rate increase for **Kapiti Coast is 9.26% or \$30 a year (58 cents a week)** for the average value residential property. All figures include GST.

The total increase in our rates revenue across the region this year is 9.8%.
