Give details:

<u>State Highway Revocation</u> – Coastlands et al are concerned the proposed access to/from the site from/to Amohia Street will impact on the future revocation of the (former) State highway, and in particular options for the access to Coastlands Parade (which is a formal road) directly opposite the train station parking; Coastlands et al have been in discussions with Council regarding the revocation of the (former) State highway at that point, and have proposed several options, some that could be detrimentally affected by the close proximity of proposed access to/from the proposed activity; the functioning of Amohia Street post-revocation is critical for Coastlands' current operations and its ability to expand in the future.

<u>Vehicle Movements</u> – Coastlands et al are concerned the Beca Peer Review has identified that the traffic volumes used for Amohia Street need updating to determine the true impact of the proposal; Coastlands is concerned the function of Amohia Street is retained at a high level of service to minimise any impacts on Coastlands' current operations and its ability to expand in the future

<u>Transport and access</u> – Coastlands et al are concerned that due to the use of dated traffic volumes, the queue lengths on Amohia Street accessing the site could be greater than predicted, disrupt traffic using the road, and cause effects on access to/from Coastlands at its main entrance and Coastlands Parade; such impacts could affect Coastlands' current operations and its ability to expand in the future.

<u>Major Traffic Activity</u> – Coastlands et al are concerned the Beca Peer Review has identified that trip generation rates for service stations are considerably higher at weekends as opposed to the weekday yet the assessment has only been undertaken for a 'peak hour' – it is unclear whether this is a peak hour for the service station or Amohia Street?; Coastlands et al is also concerned that the Beca Peer Review has identified the trip generation values associated with the activity are too low.
