National Environmental Standards

National *environmental* standards (*NES*s) are prepared by central government and can prescribe technical standards, methods (including rules) and/or other requirements for *environmental* matters throughout the whole country or specific areas. If an activity doesn't comply with an *NES*, it is likely to require a *resource consent*. *NESs* must be observed and enforced by local authorities. The following *NESs* are currently in force:
