Request for Information under the Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987 (the Act) (the LGOIMA)

Thank you for your email of **13 August 2024** requesting the following information:

The following questions were raised from a member of the public, regarding hygiene at public pools across KCDC:

1. What amount of chlorine is in the pools?

Free available chlorine (FAC) is managed and dosed automatically via our water treatment system, dependant upon secondary disinfection treatments our set points range between 2.0 mg/l and 3 mg/l which is within NZ Standards.

NZS 5826:2010 covers Pool water quality standards in Swimming Pools.

The purpose of the standard is to ensure that:

- (a) Chemical and microbiological levels are maintained to safeguard health.
- (b) Water is aesthetically acceptable.
- (c) Unnecessary discomfort is prevented.
- (d) Degradation of the pool and associated equipment is minimised.

2. How often is this checked?

Prior to use then every 3 hours of operation.

3. Have there been any infectious outbreaks in any of the pools?

There have been no infectious outbreaks in any of the pools.
