SPC 16/11/001 **WELCOME**

The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting, read the Council blessing and declared the meeting open.

PUBLIC SPEAKING TIME (for items relating to the agenda)

Flo McNeil

Ms McNeill showed a short video on the recent flooding, specifically around the Wainui Stream and surrounding paddocks at the north end of Paekākāriki. A map was tabled showing ponding and coloured lines where improvements could be made.

Ms McNeill was thanked for her presentation.

Trevor Daniell

Mr Daniell spoke in regard to the Wellington Regional Natural Hazards Management Strategy report on this agenda and his concerns over Response plans for the community and requested Council:

- review and update their tsunami plans; and
- help support and fund the Neighbourhood Support Group who could help the community be ready and able to respond in emergencies.

MEMBERS' BUSINESS

(a) Public Speaking Time Responses.

Flo McNeill

Sean Mallon, Group Manager Infrastructure Services advised that a full list of flood related capital projects including Tilley Road, Paekākāriki, would be available to Council in February with a view to potentially update the Long Term Plan.

Mr Mallon clarified that the flooding at the north end of Paekākāriki, as shown in the video, was primarily not due to the stormwater pipes but the upstream. The installation of a non-return valve would help to stop the low flow but would not fix the bigger problem, which was the capacity of the stream, the rail bridge and build-up of gravel that pushes the flow into the paddock.

Mr Mallon explained that the constraints on working on the stream were a combination of the requirements as per the new Regional Plan; any work undertaken now on open drains and streams in terms of gravel extraction or flood protection work required a consent. There were more costs involved in those activities including ecological and environmental work that needed to be done to obtain a consent to carry out the work.

Members acknowledged the work in progress and coming back to Council in February with a Works Programme. It was advised that the installation of a non-return valve would be a short term gain and could potentially provide relief to the surface water.

Trevor Daniell

Mr Daniell's comments were noted.

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Community Response Plan

Scott Dray, Senior Advisor, Community Resilience at Wellington Region Emergency Management Office (WREMO) confirmed his plans to review all local Community Response Plans. The Plans had been updated to be more of an operational guide and more user friendly, to enable communities to self-activate.

Mr Dray advised that community consultation meetings were being arranged to discuss the Response Plans and would be advertised accordingly.
